REMEMBRANCE DAY SERVICE 2020

HALLOWEEN 2020 –TRICK OR TREATING DURING A PANDEMIC

Listed below are some of Algoma Public Health's recommendations when trick or treating this year and handing out your treats:

TRICK-OR –TREATING

- Don't go trick-or-treating if you are feeling ill, even if symptoms are minor
- Choose costumes that allow a non-medical mask to be worn underneath. Make sure you can see and breath comfortably
- Only trick-or-treat with those who live in your household
- Consider pre-arranged stops/visits to family/friends only
- Carry hand sanitizer and use it after touching touch-points like doorbells or railings etc.
- Wait until you're home and have washed your hands before handling or eating candy/treats

HANDING OUT CANDY/TREATS

- Don't hand out candy if you are feeling ill, even if symptoms are minor
- Always keep a healthy distance of 2 meters from trick-or-treaters and use pre-packaged treats-put them on a table or space for trick-or-treaters to take or if you can, stand outside your door
- Do not leave self serve bowls or bulk candy in a bowl
