#### ONTARIO'S THREE-STEP ROADMAP TO SAFELY REOPEN THE PROVINCE

As of June 2, 2021 the Stay At Home Order has been lifted. However, that does not mean that the Province is reopening just yet. Premier Ford has announced Ontario's **Three-Step Roadmap** to Safely Reopen the Province under the *Reopening Ontario Act*. From now until June 14 not that much has really changed. As of May 22, 2021 there were some reopening of outdoor amenities such as golf courses, splash pads, skate parks, boat launches, tennis courts, basketball courts and outdoor gatherings for up to 5 people. Below is a guide to the three-step reopening which is **tentatively** scheduled to begin on June 14, 2021.

## STEP 1 –June 14, 2021 (Tentative) 60% of Adults Vaccinated with one

Outdoor gatherings up to 10 people
Outdoor Dining up to 4 people per
table

Outdoor fitness classes, personal training and sports training up to 10 people (no team sports)
Essential retail at 25% capacity
Non-essential retail at 15% capacity
Retail stores in malls closed unless the stores have an outside entrance
Outdoor religious services, rites and ceremonies with capacity limited to

2 meters physical distancing Horse racing and motor speedways without spectators

Outdoor horse riding
Outdoor pools and wading pools
with capacity limited to 2 meters

Outdoor zoos, landmarks, historic sites, and botanical gardens with

physical distancing

Campsites, campgrounds and short term rentals

capacity limits

Overnight camping at Ontario Parks

# STEP 2-July 5, 2021 (Tentative) 70% of Adults Vaccinated with one dose and 20% with 2nd dose

Indoor gatherings up to 5 people and
other restrictions
Outdoor dining up to 6 people per

Outdoor dining up to 6 people per table

Outdoor sports and leagues and overnight camps

Outdoor meeting and event spaces with capacity limits

Essential retail at 50 % capacity
Non-essential retail at 25% capacity
Personal care services with face
coverings and capacity limits
Outdoor cinemas & performing arts

with capacity limits

Horse racing and motor speedways

for spectators with capacity limits

Outdoor tour and guide services with capacity limits
Indoor religious services, rites or

ceremony gatherings at 15% capacity
Public libraries with capacity limits
Outdoor waterparks and amusement
parks with capacity limits
Fairs and rural exhibitions with

capacity limits
