January is our coldest month of the year and Fire Chief Jarrell would like to remind everyone about carbon monoxide safety. Carbon monoxide (CO) is known as the silent killer because it is an invisible, tasteless and odorless gas that can be deadly. CO is produced when fuels, such as propane, gasoline, natural gas, heating oil or wood do not burn completely in fuel-burning appliances and devices. To prevent carbon monoxide build up in your home ensure fuel-burning appliances, chimneys and vents are cleaned and inspected every year. Ensure outside vents and chimneys for the dryer, furnace, stove and fireplaces are always clear of snow and debris. Install a carbon monoxide alarm adjacent to each sleeping area and on every storey of your home. You should test your CO alarms every month, replace batteries every year and replace CO alarms according to the manufacturer's instructions. Your CO alarm sounds different than your smoke alarm. Test both alarms and make sure everyone in your home knows the difference between the two sounds. STAY SAFE!
